LIGHTFAIR ANNOUNCES PARTICIPANTS IN SECOND ANNUAL MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Mentors and Mentees to Speak in Panel at LightFair June 23 in Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS – May 11, 2022 – LightFair has announced its 30 mentor and mentee participants for the second annual LightFair Mentorship Program, a six-month program which aims to facilitate and foster meaningful, personalized professional connections that form the cornerstone of growth, learning and the future of lighting.

"Our Mentorship program grew nearly 30% in the one year since it launched, with up-and-coming lighting professionals eager to learn and veteran industry experts excited to share knowledge," said Dan Darby, show director. Over the course of the six months beginning in March 2022, mentor and mentee pairs check in once per month to share and absorb industry information and knowledge. They connect inperson at LightFair in Las Vegas halfway through the program and grow their educational relationship through September. This program additionally gives all participants access to an exclusive, private LinkedIn group and provides lifelong career connections.

Participants in the second annual LightFair Mentorship Program can take part as a speaker in LightFair's Mentorship Q&A Panel, moderated by Sam Koerbel, founder of Lytei, on June 23 at 10:30a.m. Speakers will be selected in the following few weeks. Admission to the Mentorship Panel discussion is free with LightFair registration.
